1. Course Objectives

To enable Students

- To get familiarized with the research methodology in English
- To develop practical, theoretical, and critical knowledge in the research field of English.

2. Qualification for Admission

- Candidates should have passed a PG degree (M.A. English Literature/Comparative studies/Linguistics)
- Candidates should have secured at least 55%
- A relaxation of 5% will be given to SC, ST candidates.

3. Duration of the Course:

The Students will undergo the prescribed course of study for a period of one academic year (Two semesters)

- 4. Medium of Study: English
- 5. Subject of Study: As given in Appendix A
- 6. Scheme of Examination : As given in Appendix B
- 7. Eligibility of the Degree:
 - Candidates will be eligible if they complete the course with a pass in the prescribed examination.
- 8. The candidate requires 75% of attendance to attend the semester examinations.
- 9. Three internal examinations will be conducted, and best two of three will be considered for the internal mark consolidation of the theory papers.
- 10. The internal marks will be awarded as 15 for written, 5 for Seminar, and 5 for assignments, totally 25 marks. Atleast two assignments and Seminars should be given for each paper.
- 11. The passing minimum is 50% (both internal and external separately) in each paper.
- 12. The candidate has to submit a dissertation of their research finding. The dissertation will be awarded 200 marks (external)
